# Update on the BC Transfer Guide

(as published in BCCAT ENGAGE ((September 2021)): Moving forward)

Look out for a bigger, better BC Transfer Guide! The site has been redesigned to improve user experience, making it more responsive, accessible, and adaptive. Countdown to launch: 10, 9, 8...

In the meantime... we invite you to check out the new Adult Basic Education (ABE) Transfer Search! Previously, ABE course articulations were provided as annually published PDFs. This new fully searchable database makes it much easier for students to explore and plan.

Work is also underway to create a transfer search facility for English as an Additional Language (EAL) course articulations. We expect that the EAL Transfer Search will be up and running shortly.

# Recruitment Update

Campus recruitment continues to connect with students in person and virtually. The Post Secondary BC tour will run online using the Pheedloop platform. High school students from B.C. will be able to watch virtual presentations and contact the team with any questions
