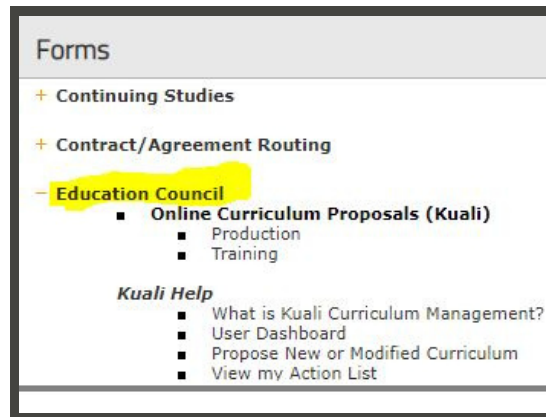


## Curriculum and Calendar Management (CCM) Project Update

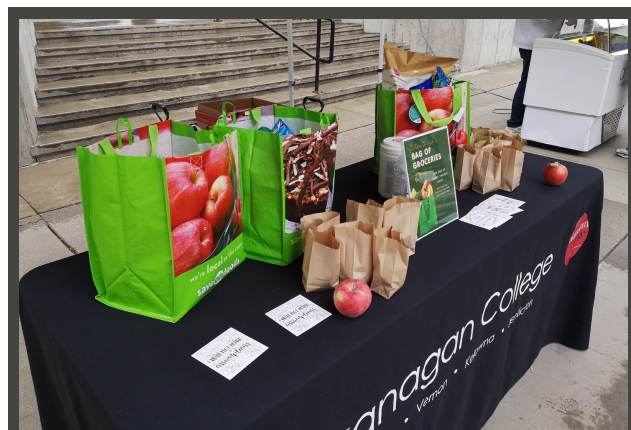
## Salmon Arm
