# **Recruitment and Events Updates**

#### Penticton

Piper Yacheson, Penticton Recruitment and Events Coordinator, has accepted a Trades Administration position in Penticton but is continuing to support recruitment two to three days a week until a new South Okanagan recruiter starts in January. Kelowna welcomed a new recruiter in December. Read more about Vivian Moretti in the Staff Updates section above. Vivian is currently in training but will hit the ground running as Experience OC, school visits, and campus tours ramp up again in the winter semester.

Winter Welcome Week events are planned for January 5-7, 2022, beginning with hot coffee and muffins for students as they head to their first classes the morning of January 5. The big welcome back lunch takes place on Thursday, Jan. 6 with a Winter Around the World theme and free cups of mac and cheese for new and returning students. Therapy dogs will be here to visit with students on January 7 during a Puppies and Popcorn event and then students are invited to an evening of skating that night at the Capital News Centre followed by appetizers at the pub next door.

#### Vernon

The Vernon Campus kicked the recruitment season off with a well-attended Counsellors Breakfast on October 8, followed by their Campus Open House & Spotlight Sessions on November 2. The open house event was attended by more than 125 people over the course of the evening and featured a program fair in the cafeteria and nine different program spotlight sessions around campus. Each session was well attended and just over 50 students took advantage of the admission fee waiver and applied for an OC program that evening. On November 8, Vernon recruiter, Tawnya Cameron, hosted the annual 15 First Year FAQs seminar. About 35 people attended the seminar.



In addition to campus event planning, Tawnya has been busy presenting to grades 10, 11 and 12 classes in all of the schools in her region, plus setting up info booths for high school parent/teacher interviews and during school lunch breaks, and running the OC booth at provincial post-secondary fairs.

In preparation for the winter semester, Tawnya is helping to plan the Winter Welcome on campus. This will consist of an information/welcome table for new students and campus tours on January 5, plus a winter welcome back event with free coffee, hot chocolate and treats on January 11.
