**MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (Revised)
ONSITE RECIPROCAL BORROWING AGREEMENT**

Since September 2005, faculty, students and staff of Okanagan College (OC) and The University of British Columbia (UBC) have had onsite borrowing privileges at each other's libraries.

Under the current agreement, OC students, staff and faculty are eligible for borrowing privileges at UBC libraries upon presentation of a valid OC faculty, staff or student card; similarly, UBC students, staff and faculty are eligible for borrowing privileges at OC libraries upon presentation of a valid UBC faculty, staff or student card. Since 2013, students, staff and faculty have been able to use library cards from their home institution, as opposed to community borrower cards, when borrowing materials from each other's libraries.

User-initiated delivery of UBC Okanagan Library books for OC students, faculty and staff is available. OC users can search the UBCO Library catalogue and place requests online for books to be sent to them at the OC campus library of their choice, without the intervention of OC Library staff. Okanagan College will provide free transportation of materials between campuses.

Users are subject to UBC and OC Library loan regulations for community borrowers, which provide onsite borrowing of collections except those restricted from community borrowing. These restricted collections may include, but are not limited to, items placed on course reserve.

This agreement will be reviewed on or before June 30, 2020.
