

STARTING ARTS & SCIENCE DEGREES AT OC AND TRANSFERRING OUT



• 1 course = 3 credits

When a student starts at one institution and plans to graduate from another institution in BC, it is important that they visit the <u>BC Transfer Guide</u>

Generally, 24-30 credits (1 year) will earn enough credits to be considered a transfer student to another institution (UBCO-O, UVIC, etc)

This would require you to take 4 or 5 courses per semester



GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS



If a student satisfies the requirements for an Associate of Arts or an Associate of Science (60 credits) and has an overall GPA of 60%, they are guaranteed that all 60 credits will transfer to other institutions within BC.

For programs other than the Associate Degrees, students are still required to have 60 credits with an overall GPA of 60%.

Each diploma has specific graduation requirements.



CLASSIFICATION OF COURSES



HUMANITIES: English, Fine Arts, French, German, History, Japanese, Mandarin, Philosophy, First Nations Indigenous Languages, Creative Writing, and Spanish

SOCIAL SCIENCES: Anthropology, Communications, Criminology, Economics, Geography (some), Indigenous Studies, Political Science, Psychology, Sociology, Gender, Sexuality, and Women's Studies

SCIENCES: Astronomy; Biology; Chemistry; Computer Science; Earth and Environmental Science; Geography (some); Mathematics; Physics; Statistics

Not all subjects are taught at all campuses



APPLIED BACHELOR OF ARTS: COMMUNITY RESEARCH AND EVALUATION

- Consists of 120 credits (40 courses)
- Four-year degree that has an option for 15 eligible graduates to earn direct entrance into the Master of Social Work foundational two-year graduate studies program at UBC-Okanagan (76% must be obtained in upper-level courses)
- Students will study the social sciences and liberal arts through applied learning which includes a field experience and a capstone research project
- Each course is 3 credits
- Must achieve a minimum of 55% in each course and a minimum cumulative average of 60% is required for graduation.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS



Successful completion of the prescribed and elective courses within a minimum graduating grade average of 60%.

Each program has specific graduation requirements and required credits to be completed.

HINTS FOR COURSE SELECTION

- Refer to course planning sheets
- Use Plan Ahead in Registration to create a timetable
- Start with course selection for classes with only one section, and which are a priority for you or your program
- If choosing courses with multiple sections, choose last as there is more than one section to choose from
- Register as soon as possible after your time ticket allows
- Register for both fall and winter semesters

If unable to meet with an education advisor prior to registering, register in what you think it correct and then talk to an advisor to confirm your selection.

Your myOkanagan email account is automatically made when you apply to Okanagan College

Some professors may send updates through this email, so it is important to make sure you are checking this email by logging into your myOkanagan account and clicking the email icon (your name@okanagan.bc.ca) at the top right of the page. We recommend that you forward your myOkanagan email to your personal account to ensure you don't miss any important updates. Here are the steps to forward your myOkanagan email account.

- Open your myOkanagan
- Selecting the email icon at the top right of the page
- Select Email
- When your myOkanagan email opens select View
- Select View Settings
- Select Forwarding
- Select Enable forwarding
- Enter your personal email address
- Select save in the bottom right corner.


Confirm you meet the prerequisites for the courses you are registered in.



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WITHDRAWING AND DROPPING COURSES

Withdrawal deadlines can be found in <u>important dates</u> – select the current or intended academic year or program schedule to find the most relevant dates for you.

A 'W' on your transcript means that you were registered in a course in a particular semester. It does not affect your grade average.

There may not be any consequences for dropping a course, however if you are required to be a full-time student (because of funding) if you drop a course, you may not be considered a full-time student. Some courses are only offered once per year, so you may need to wait until next year to take the course again.

ACADEMIC NOTICE AND PROBATION

What is <u>Academic Notice and Probation</u>?

A student falling below a 55% grade point average (gpa) in a term can have increasingly serious academic consequences. The first time this happens a student gets put on "Notice" which does not show on their record (transcript). If the student does not get above 55% in the next term after being put on "Notice", they will be put on "Probation" which will show up on their record (transcript) and they will be required to take a term off of school unless reinstated by the dean of their faculty.

How can you avoid it?

Please use the services available at the college (speaking with your professors, Success Centres and Counselling) to avoid this situation and see an Education Advisor if you have concerns about being placed on Notice or Probation.





SHARING YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION

In accordance with British Columbia's Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act (FOIPPA), you must complete a Consent to Release Information form in order for anyone other than you (family member, significant other, employer, etc.) to be able to find out information about your course/program. If there is no <u>Consent to Release</u> <u>Information</u> on file for the person making the inquiry, we will not release any information specific to your record.



FINDING YOUR REGISTRATION TIME TICKET

A registration time ticket is the exact day and time you can register for classes. An email will be sent to you to let you know when your registration time ticket is available. Your time ticket will be posted in your <u>myOkanagan</u> account under "Prepare for Registration". Your time ticket will be displayed in the Registration Status window.

PAYING YOUR FEES

Okanagan College has partnered with <u>PayMyTuition</u> to provide all students additional secure online payment options to pay your student account balances. Payments can be initiated from both Canadian financial institutions and financial institutions outside of Canada. Online debit and credit card payments initiated through Canadian institutions through this provider will include a non-refundable 2.5% convenience fee added to the base payment.

Other online payment options are available within each of these payment portals that do not include the convenience fee.

Online bill payment is also available with no additional convenience fee charges.

Payment by debit card, cheque or cash will be accepted in person to pay your student account balances. For safety reasons, payment by cash is discouraged. Credit cards are not accepted in person or over the phone to pay student account balances.
