Policy Statement

Transfer Credit for Adult Basic Education courses

The following transfer credit guidelines from the Ministry of Advanced Education apply toward an Adult Basic Education certificate or diploma.

Fundamental Certificate: At the Fundamental Level, transfer credit will not be given for work completed in the public school system. Transfer credit may be given for one course at the Fundamental level with a 50% grade or better from British Columbia colleges.

Intermediate Certificate: Transfer credit may be given for previous study for up to two courses, with a 50% grade or better in each course, at the Intermediate or Grade 10 level or higher.

Advanced Certificate: Transfer credit may be given for previous study for up to two courses, with a 50% grade or better in each course, at the Advanced or Grade 11 level or higher.

Adult Graduation Diploma: Transfer credit may be given for previous study for courses, with a 50% grade or better in each course, at the Provincial or Grade 12 level or higher.

In addition to the courses listed, transfer credit may be approved for courses chosen from (but not limited to) such programs as entry-level occupational trades training; business administration; office administration; university courses; education and career planning; visual graphic and performing arts; and appropriate Continuing Studies certificate programs.

Policy Details
