

WEIGHTED GRADE AVERAGES

The grade average is determined by dividing the sum of the course grade points by the sum of the course credits.

a) Prior to the 1989 Fall Semester,

the course grade **points** were determined by multiplying the course credit value by the numerical equivalent of the letter grade. The numerical equivalences used are as follows:

A = 4 C+ = 2.5 D = 1
B = 3 C = 2 F = 0

This method produced a grade point average between 0 and 4.0, inclusive.

b) As of the 1989 Fall Semester,

the course grade points are determined by multiplying the course credit value by the standard percent grade. The sum of the grade points divided by the sum of course credits produces a grade average between 0 percent and 100 percent, inclusive.

Because percent grades have been reported only since December, 1989, letter grades reported prior to this **are converted to a percent grade on the following basis:**

A = 87% C+ = 66% D = 53%
B = 74% C = 64% F = 42%

COLLEGE STANDARDS

- A student who obtains a semester grade average of less than 55% in a credit program is placed on academic probation.
- A student must achieve a minimum cumulative grade average of 60% to be eligible for graduation in an academic, developmental certificate or continuing education program of studies leading toward a certificate or diploma. A minimum average of 70% is required for graduation from vocational programs.
- A student graduating in a vocational, adult basic education or academic certificate or diploma program with a minimum cumulative grade average of 80% will have the designation "With Distinction" applied.
- A minimum pass in a vocational course is 60% before September 1, 1997 and 70% after that date.
