## Business

## Revised course:

## 1. BUAD 461 Applied Corporate Finance

## Proposal Rationale

The finance specialty area did a comprehensive review of this course and success factors for students. Upon review, it was determined that some of the pre-requisites were setting up unnecessary barriers for students to enter the course. As a result, they recommend changes to the existing pre-requisites to simplify the requirements.

Specifically, the current pre-requisites require a modeling class. Upon reflection it was determined that this is helpful, but not actually critical to success in the course. Therefore, prerequisites should go back to a "what do they need" level (which was in place for all years prior to Fall 2021).

Impacts to students:
These changes now remove barriers for all finance students and in addition, ensure that accounting students are not inadvertently being prevented from taking this course. These changes increase access without diminishing student learning outcomes.

## Science \& Technology

## New course:

## 1. DSCI 351 Discrete Structures for Data Science

## Proposal Rationale

MATH 251 is part of both the PBDMDA and PBDHA programs. However, it has a provincial curriculum which is inflexible. A more targeted course would better serve our students.
Therefore, we propose DSCI 351 Discrete Structures for Data Science as an alternative.

Following discussions, it is proposed to adjust the 2023-24 academic semester schedule, like the approach taken in 2022-23.

## Fall 2023

Applying the academic schedule policy, the Fall 2023 schedule would have the following key dates.

At this time, it is not known if the Sep 30 National Day of Truth and Reconciliation will be observed as a BC provincial/statutory holiday in 2023. Additionally, it has not been confirmed if/how Sep 30 will be observed when the day falls on a weekend. The schedule will include Sep 30 as tentative.

An issue for the Fall schedule is the number of instructional Mondays available. Instructional days are summarized below as if there is no replacement for the Sep 30 statutory day. If Sat, Sep 30 statutory is to be observed on a weekday by the province, then one fewer total instructional day AND if replacement is on Fri, Sep 29, then 12 instructional Fridays OR Mon, Oct 2, then 10 instructional Mondays. If there is a choice, it is suggested that it be observed on the Friday not the Monday in 2023.

## Winter 2024

Under the policy, If the New Year statutory holiday falls on a Monday, classes will begin on the immediately following Wednesday; otherwise, classes will begin on the immediately following Monday.

In 2024, January 1 is a Monday. The adjustment is to begin classes the next Monday. While the Monday start is a deviation from the policy, it allows for additional time for processing Fall grades, updating academic standing (probation or suspension), pre-requisite dropping, and other start of the semester activities to be completed before the start of classes.

## 2. Fall 2022 Semester Schedule Adjustment

Approved by Operations Committee September 20, 2022

## Background

On September 13, 2022, the Prime Minister announced that Monday, September 19, 2022, will be a holiday for federal government employees to mourn Queen Elizabeth II on the day of her state funeral. The B.C. government has also announced that provincial public sector employees should plan to observe
the day as a holiday as well. Accordingly, it is confirmed that Okanagan will be observing the holiday, consistent with other post-secondary institutions in B.C., and with the broader public sector. Okanagan College will suspend instructional activity and be closed on Monday, September 19, 2022.

## Adjusting the Schedules

Observing this day will require adjusting the 2022-23 schedules. Following the Academic Semester Scheduling Policy, there are 62 instructional days available in the Fall semester.

Following the process undertaken in Fall 2021 to implement the September 30 closure respecting the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation, options were considered for replacing the Monday, September 19, 2022, classes. After consultation, the preferred option is to extend the Fall semester classes by one day to Wednesday, December 7, if deemed necessary to cover the course content. Courses that would have been scheduled on Monday, September 19 may be rescheduled to Wednesday, December 7.

The Fall semester Final Examination schedule will remain as is - from Thursday, December 8 through Monday, December 19 (excluding Sundays). If a course ends on Monday, December 5 or Tuesday, December 6, there will continue to be, as per policy, at least two days before the scheduled final examination.

## Duolingo

1. Education Council approved the acceptance of the online Duolingo to assess applicant/student English language proficiency for applicants going forward.
